So....how's your Lent going?

Like New Year's resolutions, it is sometimes difficult to maintain a Lenten discipline much beyond...the Second Sunday in Lent? Or maybe Ash Wednesday? If your Lenten observance is going well, that is terrific. But if not, (and it happens!) rather than giving up any effort as futile, I invite you to go ahead and begin again, even if it's almost Palm Sunday. Any efforts we make to grow closer to God are valuable, and when we fall short, but nonetheless turn again toward God, we reinforce the message of Holy Week and Easter that there is absolutely nothing that can stand in the way of God's longing for us. Remember that on Ash Wednesday we were invited to the observance of a *holy* Lent, not necessarily a *successful* Lent! In a sermon used for the last sixteen centuries at Easter throughout Eastern Christendom, St. John Chrysostom writes,

First and last alike receive your reward;
rich and poor, rejoice together!
Sober and slothful, celebrate the day!
You that have kept the fast, and you that have not,
rejoice today for the Table is richly laden!

Some Lenten meditation booklets remain in the Welcome Area. We celebrate the Holy Eucharist on Tuesdays at noon and Wednesdays at 5:30 PM. The prayer book has the Daily Offices. Let us begin again.

Blessings for a holy Lent, Holy Week, and Easter.

VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

The vestry met for an off-site Vestry day on March 4th for team building and discussion of how they would function best as parish leaders. At the March 22nd meeting the vestry voted to purchase a drawer to be installed in the new sound rack for storage of the assistive hearing devices under lock and key. A new group, the Central New York Art Guild will begin meeting at Grace in September, and will donate \$50 per monthly meeting. The Art Guild meets the second Thursday of the month from 6-9 PM September through May, except for December. For Easter services vestry members will provide for a properly festive and welcoming coffee hour and be intentional about interacting with visitors and those who do not attend regularly.

THANKS PROPERTY GUYS!!

A big THANK YOU to our hardworking Property committee. Projects recently completed include positioning and securing the new china cabinet in the parlor, repairing the curtain rod mount in the music room, removing the old sound system speakers, sound rack and electronics, retrieving Grace-purchased salt from the previous snow plowing contractor, replacing burnt-out light bulbs, and retrieving Holy Week and Easter items from the attic. Items in process or planning include a portion of a video inventory for property insurance purposes, installing Lucite boxes on thermostats to prevent misuse, investigating possible roof leaks in the office entrance building and the ladies room in the parish center, repairing a bracket on the organ bench, arranging for tree-trimming near the flag pole, and stripping and recoating the flooring in the Welcome Area. Sunday, May 7th is Parish Clean-up Day. Following a 9 A.M. Holy Eucharist service we will clean both the grounds and inside the church. We have light jobs for those who are unable to do heavier work. Lunch will be served at Noon.

NEW SOUND SYSTEM

By now most people have enjoyed the benefits of our new state-of-the-art sound system, donated in memory of John and Pat McFall by their children, John S, Laura and Carrie. Additional funding was given in memory of Alan C. Sward and other departed members of Grace Church. The system consists of a sound-processor (computer), one speaker located above and behind the pulpit, adjusted to cover the entire room, new microphones on longer stalks at the pulpit and lectern, wiring for additional mics at the altar rail gate and altar, two body mic packs, two over-the ear mics and two lapel mics. There are four assistive hearing devices for the hearing impaired consisting of an earphone or T-coil loop. Also monitor speakers and volume controls in the old narthex (low-ceiling entryway), Welcome Area, Undercroft and Nursery. The system was designed and installed by DCI Sound of Skaneateles. A memorial plaque will be installed soon, and we plan to dedicate the sound system on May 7th at our 9:00 A.M. service. Mark your calendar to attend and thank these generous donors!

BYLAWS CHANGE

There has been some confusion since the Annual Meeting about the proposed change to the parish bylaws. The change is to alter the number of vestry members from nine to six. The change was proposed due to chronic difficulty in finding a sufficient number of persons willing to be on the vestry.

Now we elect annually: Proposed we elect annually:

3 for 3-year terms 2 for 3-year terms

plus however many are necessary to fill unexpired terms.

PROPOSED IMPLEMENTATION

2018 - Pass resolution to change bylaws for the 2nd time and file with county clerk

Elect 3 for 3-year term – total 9 vestry members

2019 – Elect 2 for 3-year term – total 8 vestry members

2020 – Elect 2 for 3-year term – total 7 vestry members

2021 – Elect 2 for 3-year term – total 6 vestry members

Note that the number of wardens and all other provisions of our current bylaws would remain the same. This method of implementation and the numbers of vestry members (i.e., multiples of three) are governed by diocesan canons and New York religious corporation laws. If desired in future, the number could be increased via the same process.

CONFIRMATION CLASS BEGINS

You are invited to be confirmed, to be received into this Communion or to be reaffirm your baptismal vows. You will explore with your mentor/sponsor the aspects of being a disciple of Jesus Christ and a member of the Episcopal Church. Our three-month “Keeping the Promise” confirmation classes will be held each Sunday from 9:10 - 10:15 A.M. at the church. A date for confirmation with the bishop has not been set yet.

Members of Altar Guild will be polishing the church brass on Saturday April 8 at 9 A.M. All are welcome to come join.


EASTER FLOWERS
