Time is running out

When I was a small child, my family would stop at a little deli/convenience store on the way home from church, and one of us kids would be sent inside to pick up the Sunday New York Times. During Advent, as the weeks counted down toward Christmas, we'd carol, "Christmas is coming; the Times is getting fat" because the paper was so stuffed with ad inserts that we could barely carry it. Every week there were more ads, each getting more and more hysterical about how TIME IS RUNNING OUT!!

Even now, I see social media posts from friends and friends-of-friends who are already worried that time is running out to complete shopping and decorating and writing Christmas cards and it is ALREADY after Thanksgiving.

But in the church, Christmas comes only after Advent. And Advent is about waiting. About keeping awake. About not missing the signs of God at work in the world or in ourselves. It's about repenting of our resistance to God's work in us, inspiring our hopes and dreams of a world reconciled to God where the hungry are fed, the mournful, comforted, and everything and everyone is perfectly reconciled to God. It's about seeing the dreams and promises and hopes enacted in history—in history writ large, and in our own personal history. The history of "In the Beginning" and at the End, where the promises of God were and are enacted, and where we are oh-so-gradually transformed, as we work and wait on the Lord, and he waits on us, that the same Light kindled in us may shine forth in our lives to the glory of God.

Time is indeed running out, so I encourage you to take time this Advent to keep awake, to note the signs, to dream God's dream of a reconciled world.



VESTRY MEMBERS NEEDED FOR 2018

The work of the vestry has two faces: leadership and management. As a vestry member, together with the rector and wardens, you will be expected to manage and lead.

Management includes such tasks as: budgeting, establishing and enforcing policies and procedures, establishing action plans, maintaining property.

Leadership includes such tasks as articulating and communicating the vision for the future of the parish, generating enthusiasm and "buy-in" from the congregation, and as needed, taking personal responsibility for ensuring ad hoc or permanent committees carry out their assigned work.

Vestry members should be able to make the following commitments:

- Vestry meetings (1x per month, plus occasional additional meetings as needed);
- Committee work (usu. 1x per month);
- Vestry retreat (annual);
- Regular attendance at worship services (rotating services occasionally);
- Congregational events: coffee hours, meals, fundraisers, adult education programs, etc.;
- Diocesan meetings, as necessary;
- Annual meeting.
- Exercise confidentiality and practice healthy, honest, open communication patterns in the parish.

Qualifications:

- Eighteen years of age or older;
- Baptized; (wardens must be confirmed)
- Active member of the parish who is regular in worship attendance and contribution of time, talent and treasure.

ADVENT EVENT

Parish life is holding Advent activities after each service December 3rd, which is the first Sunday in Advent. Christmas cards will be available for you to write notes to our parish family members who are unable to join us regularly, as well as notes to military members.



Stations will also be set up for you to make live advent wreaths. A \$5 donation for each wreath would be helpful to defray the cost of materials.

Proposed modification to the By-Laws of Grace Episcopal Church, Baldwinsville, New York to reduce the number of Vestry Members from 9 to 6.

By NYS law, this resolution to amend the by-laws requires passage twice by a parish meeting before it goes into effect. The following resolution was passed by the Vestry at its regular meeting on December 28, 2016, and by the Parish Annual Meeting on January 22, 2016. If passed again at the January 2018 meeting, it will be effective for the January 2019 election.

WHEREAS

for a number of years there has been chronic difficulty in obtaining a sufficient number of qualified and able vestry candidates, and

Whereas the available volunteer resources of the parish might be better distributed across the various ministries of the parish, rather than concentrated in the vestry,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT

Article IV Section 3 of the By-Laws of Grace Episcopal Church be amended to read:

At each annual Meeting there shall be elected for their regular terms of two (2) and three (3) years respectively, one (1) Warden and **two (2)** Vestry members. In the event that any Warden or Vestry member is elected to serve an un-expired term, that term shall expire at the same date as that of the person originally elected to such office, and whom he or she succeeded.

And

Article V Section 1 be amended to read:

The Vestry shall be composed of the Rector, two (2) Wardens and **six (6)** Vestry members.

Further discussion of concerns expressed at the January 2017 Annual Meeting:

We have vestry representatives on each of the parish ministries and there won't be enough vestry members to do that.

In practice, some vestry members already serve with multiple ministries. It seems that reducing the number of people on the vestry frees individuals to serve in other needed capacities. Right-sizing our vestry to the size, capacity, wiliness and ability to serve of our congregation as it exists now suggests greater effectiveness may be obtained with a smaller vestry.

What about possible tied votes with a vestry made up of an even number?

In practice, we are at risk of this situation frequently, as not every vestry member is able to attend every meeting. In the case of a tie with all present, the rector may vote. Robert's Rules of Order Revised 11th ed. specifies that the chair, if a member of the voting body, has exactly the same rights and privileges as all other members, including voting (not just to break a tie). According to the canons of the church, our bylaws, and NYS Law, the vestry is made up of rector, wardens and vestry members.

Won't it be even harder to obtain a quorum with fewer people?


In fact, we have been unable to transact business at a few scheduled vestry meetings due to unexpected absences of vestry members. With fewer people, rescheduling such meetings would be somewhat easier.
