At the age of about 30, Julian experienced a grave illness, so grave in fact, that it was presumed she would die. As the priest administered Last Rites, a crucifix was held over her sickbed and Julian saw the figure on the cross begin to bleed. What followed was a series of sixteen



visions of Jesus. She recovered, became an anchoress (living in a cell connected to the church, and spending her time in prayer) and wrote about her visions in what was titled *Revelations of Divine Love*. Some twenty or thirty years later, Julian wrote a much longer revision exploring the theology and meaning of these visions. In it she said that Jesus told her in her vision that sin was 'behovely', (a word which means something like 'necessary', 'expedient', or 'fitting'), because it brings people to the knowledge of their need for God. She compares God's love that of a mother for her child, and that God sees us as perfect and waits for the time when human souls mature so that evil no longer hinders us.

Julian lived during a grim period of history, including epidemics of the plague called the Black Death. Scholars speculate that she may have lost her entire family to the plague, and therefore become an anchoress. Life was difficult during the period, with the Hundred Years' War, the Peasants' Revolt, and the usurpation of the throne by Henry the 4th. Trials of heretics during this period resulted in executions in sometimes nasty ways. Yet Julian's writing is full of joy. She writes that God can draw good even from evil, and that Jesus told her that if we but trust in him, "All shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of thing shall be well".

In the midst of difficulties, discouragement, divisions and challenges in our lives and the lives of those around us, may we heed Dame Julian's revelation from Jesus, "All shall be well." if we trust and follow him.

- \* Heard from guests concerning additional suggestions for balancing the 2018 budget.
- \* It was decided to have a full-bore stewardship campaign this year, something that that has not been done for several years.
- \* Two new members, Jan and John Heisler, joined the Memorials Committee.
- \* Action was deferred on the new water softener system because a second bid has been received.
- \* Blaine Fleming had previously made an offer to match any gift given to offset the budget deficit. A gift of \$1000.00 has been received, and the offer is still open.
- \* A special Vestry meeting will be held on July 11th to discuss the suggestions that have been made for reducing the current budget deficit and finding ways to increase in come and limit expenses to prevent future deficits.

### SUMMER SERVICES

As has been done here for a number of years, we will be moving to a single Sunday service at 9 A.M. from July 1 to September 9. The First Saturday 4 P.M. service will be on hiatus as well. The Tuesday noon Holy Eucharist will continue except during Mother Cathy's vacation.

### GENERAL CONVENTION, AUSTIN TX JULY 5-13


Ever wonder how the Episcopal Church is governed? The General Convention is the governing body of the Episcopal Church made up of the House of Deputies, which has more than 800 lay and clergy members, and the House of Bishops, which is comprised of nearly 300 active and retired bishops. The Convention meets every three years and has the authority to amend the Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church; adopt the budget for the church for the next three years; authorize liturgical texts and amend the Book of Common Prayer; adopt communions and covenants with other churches; set qualifications for orders of ministry and office-holders; elect officers of the General Convention, the Executive Council, and members of boards; and delegate responsibilities to the interim bodies of the Episcopal Church.
