To help with our budget deficit and to be more environmentally responsible, beginning in October, most parish members and friends will receive our monthly newsletter *Grace Notes* via email. Others may pick up a copy in the Welcome Area when they are at church. We are happy to first-class mail *Grace Notes* to shut-ins, newcomers and those living at a distance.

GRACE CHURCH IS GOING GREEN!

Your vestry is working to reduce our budget deficit and their hard work has identified some ways we can go green and save money at the same time. Let us know what you think of these changes, and any other ideas you may have.

- Beginning with the October issue, *Grace Notes* will be published in electronic form and emailed to everyone for whom we have an email address. Our shut-ins and those at a distance who don't have email will receive hard copies via first-class mail. Others may pick up *Grace Notes* in the Welcome Area or office. Additional copies will be available for newcomers and visitors. This will reduce paper and printing costs, and allow us to eliminate the bulk mail permit as well as a significant amount of postage. Remember also that *Grace Notes* is always available on our website.
- Beginning in mid-September we will experiment with a reduced bulletin for most Sundays. Our new sound system makes it easy to hear readers, so only the citation for readings and page number for the collect will be provided. This will reduce the paper and printing costs by half or more. As a ministry of hospitality, full large-format bulletins will still be used for occasions when the service is complicated and/or a large number of visitors are expected (Christmas, Easter, baptisms, funerals, etc.).
- We have already increased our communications by sending This Week at Grace announcements via Mail Chimp email every Friday afternoon. This has the added benefit of ensuring those who are not present still receive our community announcements and weekly liturgical schedule, and slightly reduces the number of copies we need to print.
- ◆ We are looking into providing a means for people to give to Grace electronically, both for regular contributions and one-time gifts via our website. One study indicates 42% of churches have "e-giving" available, and in those churches, 59% of folks 66 years and older participate. Many churches experience a 10-30% increase in giving when they move to such a system, and of those aged 20-35, a whopping 75% prefer electronic giving. This program would be entirely voluntary, and all potential vendors meet strict e-commerce/banking standards for information security. Reusable cards indicating electronic giving can be made available to place in the offering plate for those who wish to use them. If you would be interested in electronic giving, please speak with Mother Cathy.
- Our church management software has the capacity to allow members to access their own profile information and their current giving record. We are looking into enabling that feature for those individuals who would like to see their giving record online whenever they prefer. Paper statements would be produced for all other givers and available for pick-up in the Welcome Area 3 times per year as is current practice. Would you be interested in managing your own church profile and seeing your giving record whenever you like? Please contact the office.
- Recycling of refundable bottles and cans will become a year-round option. Youth may request to manage the recycling for a period of time as a method to raise funds for a mission or youth event trip, and the parish will manage and receive the funds raised the rest of the time.

As Christians, what is our calling?

It's to follow Jesus—to follow in the Way that he taught his disciples. And that Way is transformation from the world's perspective of competitive me-first scarcity, to other-centered, open-handed gratitude for the abundance God gives. As theologian Marcus Borg points out, "Jesus incarnates the way. Incarnation means embodiment. Jesus is what the way embodied in a human life looks like."

In our world today, it is far too easy to absorb the competitive, me-first perspective that sees our status, money and possessions as what gives us worth, and the need to jealously guard these things from all threats. But in Jesus we see the generous, open handed gratitude for the abundance of God and the model of sharing the Good News that we are beloved not because of status or wealth or correct belief or behavior, but simply because we are God's. Our response to that love is what calls us to be transformed to better reflect the glory of God. Everything else we do in worship, family, work, leisure, serving those in need, and so forth is in response to that overwhelming love. As Presiding Bishop Michael Curry put it, "Love is the answer".


OUTREACH "PET PROJECT" TO BENEFIT HUMANECNY ANIMAL SHELTER

Due to our budget deficit, at the July meeting the vestry voted to reduce the position of Music Director to Organist, beginning in September. With this budget-driven change from having a Music Director to having an Organist, and the recent scheduling difficulties due to choir members' availability, the choir has determined that it no longer can serve on most Sundays. We still hope to have a choir for such holidays as Christmas and Easter, and to make use of our talented instrumentalists and soloists on some Sundays. Music planning will be accomplished by a committee who will meet with Mother Cathy 3 or 4 times per year to select and schedule hymns and service music. We hope that additional people might join us for the special holiday choir.


