Dear People of Grace,

In the last Grace Notes, I wrote to you,

Lacking the visible star that the Magi followed, how might we discern where God is calling Grace Church at this time? How might we make Good News known to all people in our neighborhood, and at the same time manage our inevitable anxiety about change?

It seems that we have already begun that discernment process!

Our Annual Meeting, scheduled for January 20, and postponed by 14" of snow and bitter cold, was held on January 27th between the 8:00 and 10:30 services. The newly-constituted vestry met for the first time on January 30th (also postponed). Thanks to all who participated in the Annual Meeting and helped us keep on track in order to complete our business within the hour-and-aquarter we had available. At that meeting we heard about the many suggestions you have provided to the vestry, to reduce our expenses, increase our income and increase membership, and the vestry's actions on them so far. Despite our compressed schedule, we also had enough time to hear some great new suggestions which are listed elsewhere in this issue. Thank you!

At the first meeting of the new vestry it was determined that Grace Church will participate in this year's diocesan Learning Communities Initiative (LCI). Sue Purdy and Allen Wolf have agreed to serve as guiding team, and others will be needed to support their efforts. Additional members for the guiding team would be most beneficial, as teams usually consist of 4-6 individuals. The experience includes three Saturday workshops and ongoing coaching calls with diocesan leaders.

The benefits of LCI are described as follows:

Participating congregations will be discerning their unique answer to this question: "When you consider the gifts you have been given and the needs of our world, what future do you imagine God is bringing forth in our midst?" The answer needs to come from Christ and our willingness to ask hard questions and listen for answers, as well as our ability to take risks, secure in our standing in Christ.

On December 9th we had Carol Ackley, one of the diocesan leaders for this program at both services to introduce the LCI. Pastoral Care - When to call a priest

Any member of the parish may call at any hour of the day or night, seven days a week, in the event of a pastoral crisis such as someone dying, someone in grave danger, or other pastoral emergency. If possible, a priest should be called when someone is near death to administer Last Rites and pray with the family. If not possible, a priest should be contacted whenever a parishioner has died. Call the office or the rector's office voice mail for the pastoral care emergency phone number. Also please call the rector or church office when someone is ill or hospitalized, experiencing distress and needs pastoral care, wants to discuss spiritual or theological matters, has reason to celebrate or when just wants to talk to a priest.


