Celebrations of the summer solstice in the northern hemisphere have occurred since the Stone Age. Christianity celebrates the Feast of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, one of only two major "birthday" feasts (the other is Christmas), but the celebration long pre-dates even St. John himself. Something about the longest day, with the most daylight, marking the beginning of summer, prompts people to celebrate.

- Appointed Stacey Wolf as Vestry Clerk for the remainder of 2019
- Received an update from Allen Wolf on the Learning Communities Initiative. While many great ideas have come from this program, Allen indicated that there has been very little participation from our Grace family.
- Discussed several fundraising ideas and approved a "Trunk & Treasure Sale" event for August. Also, we will be implementing a fee for high school student parking. The fee will not apply to active student members of Grace.
- Stacey Wolf updated the Vestry on what has been done by the Grace in Community Ministry. (Signs, Mailbox for Prayer Requests and Grace Episcopal pens to distribute around the community).
- Brad Pettit attended a Stewardship Workshop and filled the Vestry in on how we need to make this a year-round project.
- Mo. Cathy updated the Vestry on potential outreach opportunities through local organizations she has been actively involved with (Baldwinsville Faith Communities and Baldwinsville Community Strategic Planning).

SUMMER OUTREACH PROJECT



Another "Peanut Butter Sundae Sunday"!

Last year the Outreach Ministry's summer project was to collect jars of peanut butter for Cato-Meridian School's Packs and Snacks program. The program began four years ago when teachers noted that although some students were receiving free breakfasts and lunches during school, they did not have adequate food on weekends and during vacations. Some of the teachers decided to start the snack program, which was modeled after one in Southern Cayuga County. On Friday afternoons and before each vacation, students who are accepted by the program are given a bag of nutritious snacks. Four years ago there were 15 students in the program; currently over 65 students are enrolled in the program. The cost is approximately \$600 a month with supplements from donations.

Last summer Grace Church donated over 100 jars of peanut butter. This was much appreciated since peanut butter is a relatively high priced item, and is always in short supply.

This year we will collect 16-ounce jars of peanut butter for Cato's Packs and Snacks program during the months of **July and August**. This year, **July 14** is designated as "Peanut Butter

Sundae Sunday." After the combined service, we will be serving vanilla or chocolate ice cream with chocolate sauce, peanut butter sauce, and all the trimmings. Come and enjoy and don't forget to pick up a couple of extra jars of peanut butter to bring to church anytime during the months of July and August. Thanks!


