Recently I was re-reading some of the parts of the prayer book which we don't use in services, including the Catechism. It is enlightening to see the changes since my own Confirmation class, based on the 1928 book!

Our 1979 Book of Common Prayer provides An Outline of the Faith; commonly called the Catechism (beginning on page 845) which uses a question and answer format to summarize the Christian faith from our particular Anglican perspective. Under the section entitled "The Church" we find the following,

- *Q.* What is the mission of the Church?
- A. The mission of the Church is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ.
- Q. How does the Church pursue its mission?
- A. The Church pursues its mission as it prays and worships, proclaims the Gospel, and promotes justice, peace, and love.
- *Q.* Through whom does the Church carry out its mission?
- A. The Church carries out its mission through the ministry of all its members.

And then, under the section entitled "Ministry" we find,

- Q. Who are the ministers of the Church?
- A. The ministers of the Church are lay persons, bishops, priests, and deacons.
- Q. What is the ministry of the laity?
- A. The ministry of lay persons is to represent Christ and his Church; to bear witness to him wherever they may be; and, according to the gifts given them, to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world; and to take their place in the life, worship, and governance of the Church.
- Q. What is the duty of all Christians?
- A. The duty of all Christians is to follow Christ; to come together week by week for corporate worship; and to work, pray, and give for the spread of the kingdom of God.

By contrast, in the 1928 Prayer Book the related questions included only,

- Q. What is the Church?
- A. The Church is the Body of which Jesus Christ is the Head, and all baptized people are the members.
- Q. What is thy bounden duty as a member of the Church?
- A. My bounden duty is to follow Christ, to worship God every Sunday in his Church; and to work and pray and give for the spread of his kingdom.

The emphasis in the Catechism has shifted from definition to more dynamic and detailed description focused on the mission and ministry of all of God's people—lay and ordained. It also moves us away from the mistaken idea that the only "real" ministry is done within the walls of the church building or by those who are ordained.

In our own age we are finding it necessary to return to the kind of evangelism and ministry like that practiced by Jesus's disciples and in the churches of the New Testament. Everyone is a minister and an evangelist, wherever they may be. Everyone is to share in spreading the good news to those outside of our walls. Everyone is to be a reconciler, promoting justice, peace, and love. To share good news is to enter into relationship with others. Our Learning Communities Initiative is a first step doing this, and in seeing what God is calling everyone at Grace Church to do and be in our particular location. What's God up to here and now in this place?


