# Grace Notes—July 2020



### Mother Cathy's Corner

As of June 16, 2020, the Episcopal Diocese of Central New York is in Step 2 – Early regathering and our parish may now submit a Covenant for Gathering Anew to the bishop's office for approval. Once approved by the bishop, limited in-person gatherings, following all diocesan Step 2 guidelines, may resume on or after July 5, 2020. At the June 24 meeting, the vestry discussed how gathering anew might look here at Grace. A covenant plan is being prepared and will be submitted for approval as soon as it is ready. Physical preparations of the space are being made, as are plans for office and cleaning procedures.

Our Zoom services and virtual coffee hour will continue on Sunday mornings, and short in-person services of Holy Eucharist will be held on Tuesdays at 12 noon and Saturdays at 5:00 pm. Fifteen individuals may attend each service, including the celebrant. Everyone present will be required to:

- maintain physical distance of 6 feet.
- wear a mask over the nose and mouth at all times.
- use hand sanitizer upon arrival, and before and after receiving communion.
- refrain from physical contact with other people or unnecessarily touching surfaces.
- remain in their seats except as directed.
- Please bring your own Book of Common Prayer. For those without a copy, the church will lend one to you to take home and bring to future services. This allows us to reduce our use of paper.
- Hymnals are not necessary as there will be no singing.

Note that the windows will be kept open, and fans deployed to exhaust air from the building, so it may be cooler or warmer than usual. There will be no coffee hour or gathering before or after services. Communion will be in one kind – only the Bread is permitted.

Due to the limited numbers permitted at each service, advance sign-up will be necessary through email, phone call or voice mail message to the parish office. Available spaces will be filled in the order calls, messages and emails are timestamped or received and will only be accepted from 7AM Sunday for the upcoming Tuesday or Saturday services. You will receive a confirmation email or call if your sign-up is successful. If you later find yourself unable to attend, please

let us know as soon as possible so that someone else can have your place. We will be maintaining a log of all people present and their contact information in case of need for contact tracing.

If you are not feeling well, or have a fever or cold-like symptoms, please do not attend public worship or church meetings. If you become ill within two weeks after you have attended services, please notify us as soon as possible.

A notification will be sent out when our covenant plan has been accepted by the bishop's office containing any additional information you may need and news about when we can begin accept sign-ups.

I urge you to take care of yourself and remain at home if that is best for you based on your individual circumstances and those of your household. Taking appropriate precautions is not a failure of faith or nerve, but the way in which we love our neighbors as ourselves.

In the early days of the Church, people marveled at the care Christians showed for one another, regardless of ethnicity, wealth or social position. During epidemic plague in the third century (before Christianity was made legal), the love Christians displayed towards others won many converts. In our longing to "get back to normal" we must remember that as followers of Jesus, we are responsible for and to our neighbors, including their physical, mental and spiritual health. To this end it is our policy to exercise great care to endure all are safe, and all are included. For these reasons we will continue Zoom church services for the foreseeable future for the sake of those for whom in-person gatherings pose risk, and regular phone calls to all who would like to receive them. Thanks to all of our parish callers who exercise baptismal ministry in the way!
