

# Mother Cathy's Corner

A number of years ago, on All Saints' Sunday, a retired priest whom I greatly admired was hospitalized due to the cancer he had been battling. Those of us at Evensong that day heard about it at the service. Of course, many prayers were offered, and continued to be offered during the following days. Two weeks later, on the feast of Christ the King, just after the conclusion of Evensong, we heard that he had, within that hour, joined the great cloud of witnesses who stand before the throne of God. It seemed especially fitting that the last chapter of the life of this holy man should play out in concert with the liturgical themes of the pre-Advent season, as his family, friends and fellow Christians prayed, that we may run without stumbling to obtain God's promises<sup>1</sup>, that we might be made like Christ in his eternal and glorious kingdom<sup>2</sup>, that we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life<sup>3</sup>, and that we might be freed and brought together under [Christ's] most gracious rule<sup>4</sup>.

We in the U.S. associate November with "the holiday season" because "Turkey Day", (followed by "Black Friday" and "Cyber Monday") begins the frenetic dash that won't be over until post-holiday sales in January. But in the Church's calendar, giving thanks is the theme for the entire month. Thanksgiving for all the saints. Thanksgiving for all souls, Thanksgiving for the abundance in our lives. Thanksgiving for a different kind of leadership in Christ. Our every-Sunday service is even named after the great Prayer of Thanksgiving it contains; the Eucharistic prayer.

To live a life filled with gratitude—to live eucharistically, is to live a life filled with God, and to participate in God's abundant vision for the world. Thanks be to God!

# OCTOBER VESTRY MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- Property repair and maintenance costs are high on September financial report due to costs associated with the August flooding caused by failure of the sump pump. The insurance claim check received in October will offset this.
- There may soon need to be a roof replacement for the Parish Center and connector building.
- Ash McNamara is working on a way of visually representing the in-person and online Sunday attendance.
- Vestry has approved our NYS Hero Act plan.
- An additional plaque for the Memorial Garden has been ordered.
- Our diocesan Ministry Grant application to fund Phase 2 internet and livestreaming improvements has been submitted and is in review.
- The Parish Work Group has been accomplishing tasks The wooden shields above the altar and the womens restroom sign in the parish center have been reaffixed.
- Vestry nominees are needed. Consider this service to your church when you pledge.
- Parish administrator hours, duties and compensation were discussed.
- Grace Church follows the COVID-19 CDC and NYS recommendations for masking. Masks are to be worn in the building at all times.

Vestry Member Qualifications Are you called to lead? The work of the vestry has two faces: leadership and management. As a vestry member, together with the rector and wardens, you will be expected to manage and lead. Vestry members should be able to make the following commitments:

- Vestry meetings (1x per month, plus occasional additional meetings as needed);
- © Committee work (usu. 1x per month);
- Vestry retreat (annual);
- Regular attendance at worship services (rotating services occasionally);
- © Congregational events: coffee hours, meals, fundraisers, adult ed. programs, etc.;
- Diocesan meetings, as necessary;


- a Annual meeting.
- © Exercise confidentiality and practice healthy, honest, open communication patterns in the parish.

#### Qualifications


- Eighteen years of age or older;

# PET PROJECT BLESSING OF THE ANIMALS SERVICE



# Pumpkin Pie (With toasted Coconut Crown)

Mrs. William Halligan

2/3 c. dark brown sugar, firmly packed

2 eggs, slightly beaten

1 tsp. cinnamon

1 2/3 c. evaporated milk, 14 1/4 - oz. can

1/2 tsp. nutmeg

19-inch unbaked pie shell

3/4 tsp. ginger

1 1/2 c. canned or cooked sieved pumpkin

1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 c. shredded coconut, chopped

1/2 c. dark brown sugar

Whipped cream, if desired



Mix the 2/3 cup dark brown sugar, spices, salt and pumpkin. Mix eggs and milk. Stir into pumpkin mixture. Pour into pie shell. Bake in hot oven, 450 deg. F. for 15 minutes. Reduce heat to moderate oven, 350 deg. F. and bake 35 to 40 minutes longer or until a knife inserted in center comes out clean. Mix the 1/2 cup dark brown sugar and coconut. Sprinkle on top of hot pie. Brown under broiler for 2 or 3 minutes. Cool. Serve garnished with whipped cream, if desired.
