Mother Cathy's Corner

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and mediating on God's holy Word...

Every Ash Wednesday we hear this invitation to go deeper for a season. Go deeper into God's Word. Go deeper into the undeniable fact that we will each die. That our time is limited. Go deeper into the question, what in my life matters?

As a child I found Lent to be interminable. The music in church

seemed gloomier, the crosses were all covered up, and decorations were removed. We were encouraged to "give up" something for Lent – usually something good, like chocolate or soda. But there were some compensations. A fun weekday afternoon program for children during Lent. Fish every Friday (I love fish!). And most of all, a sense that we who observe Lent were leaning in to the faith we professed all year. A sense that this stuff *mattered*.

I wonder if you have a similar split opinion about Lent? Both the reluctance toward the work of self-examination, self-denial, prayer, fasting etc., and a certain relish that at least for a time, we can try to get back on track toward being who God has called us to be. We will, of course, fall short of this goal, for all kinds of reasons, but chief among them, because we are human. And that too, is a good thing, because we are reminded that we are not God. There is a certain liberation in confronting the fact that God is God and we are not. It means we are not responsible for everything and everyone else. We are not doomed to hold up the whole world, or even our tiny part of it. And for the things we *are* responsible for, we can always rely on the help of God, who loves us beyond measure.




theme is Everything Maple, so time travel back to fall and re-

- Edible treats are also fine—small cookies, Easter candy, fruit gummies, crackers. (Please make sure these are individually wrapped or in individual packets)


