Mother Cathy's Corner

I was recently reminded that our "new" church sound system was dedicated five years ago this month. Gifts in memory of John & Pat McFall, Alan Sward and other departed members of Grace Church paid for the system which was designed and installed by DCI Sound of Skaneateles. It was designed and built as a relatively straightforward system to amplify speech, with an FM loop addon for use with T-coil equipped hearing aids or small receivers with earphone. This system replaced one that had served for many years, but was no longer repairable.

At the time it was dedicated, this new sound system seemed very high-tech. No one could have predicted that it would be foundational to our live streaming efforts prompted by a global pandemic.

After the resumption of alternate-week in-person services in 2020, we began experimenting with a Facebook live stream. The first efforts using a smart phone were not so good due to the combination of masks and compensating increased volume of the sound system. The reverberation in the church distorted the sound badly. DCI helped us find a clever and not-very-expensive solution, using the FM loop that feeds the devices for the hearing impaired. One small piece of equipment and a couple of cables, and we could feed sound from the mics directly into the smart phone via the sound system.

We have continued to use this setup, switching out the smart phone Mevo cameras controlled by an iPad. (Some of the additional costs were taken from memorials, and most from a diocesan ministry grant). We now have a pretty respectable and definitely audible live stream for parishioners at home or away, and for anyone else who wishes to attend our services online.

Some gifts are like that. Beyond their initial usefulness, five, ten, twenty, fifty years down the road, they may turn out to be exactly what is needed. Those who are remembered, and the donors of the gifts often never know the effect, and could not possibly have imagined it.

The same is true of our own efforts as Christ's hands and feet in the world. We will likely never know the impact of most of our efforts. We may never see the people whose lives have been changed for the better. But our efforts do matter. Circumstances may provoke us into doing things we never thought we'd need to do, and taking on challenges for which we feel ourselves unequipped, but our efforts to spread Christ's love in the world are always holy work.

Syracuse Home Worship


