Mother Cathy's Corner



From 1994 through 1997 there was an all-female Canadian "death metal" band, named *November Grief*. The band's original name was *Mistrust*, but it was changed because, according to the band, "...this name fit the music better." Although I'm far from a death-metal enthusiast, I'm intrigued by this re-naming. I wonder if it unintentionally reflects a larger truth.

November can be a difficult month. The days grow colder and shorter, much of the vegetation dies, and many

people find depression and grief intensified. Even in our church's lectionary readings, themes of death and end times predominate. There are a few bright spots, with the celebration of Thanksgiving in the US, and the beginning of Advent, leading up to Christmas, but these too, can be difficult, especially for those facing loss.

The loss of those dear to us, whether recent or long past may be mourned, and lesser losses may be mourned as well: The loss of proximity when friends or family members move far away. The loss of a long-time home upon downsizing. The loss of identity from the end of work, or volunteer positions. The loss of physical capabilities. The loss of economic security in a time of rampant inflation.

All of these losses may cause us to draw back from others, and perhaps from God, out of discouragement or shame, or the idea that "we shouldn't ought to feel this way". But as we hear at every funeral, we believe that in death, "life is changed, not ended…" and as the Book of Common Prayer states,

... Joy [of the certainty of God's love in Christ]...does not make human grief unchristian. The very love we have for each other in Christ brings deep sorrow when we are parted by death. Jesus himself wept at the grave of his friend. So, while we rejoice that one we love has entered into the nearer presence of our Lord, we sorrow in sympathy with those who mourn.

At the beginning of November we rejoice with – and mourn – those great Saints of the Church, who have shown us what a life of faith looks like, and remember also our own beloved dead. The celebration of All Saints Day and All Souls day, are usually rolled into one on the Sunday following as All Saints Sunday, this year occurring on November 6th.

I invite you to enter into this period of remembering, of acknowledging our grief and our gratitude, and to share with others what losses and blessings you are experiencing, and to give thanks for our Christian trust in God, who wipes the tears from every eye, who cannot be separated from us – or from those we mourn by anything in all creation. Not even death.






