Mother Cathy's Corner

Whatever happened to the Gesimas?

No, that's not a family you don't remember, nor the name of a TV series!

Before our 1979 prayer book, the Episcopal Church observed a season called "Pre-Lent" that included three Sundays with peculiar names: Septuagesima, Sexagesima, and Quinquagesima. They were observed by the western Christian church from about the sixth century, and were retained after the Reformation by Roman Catholics, Anglicans and some Lutherans. This pre-Lenten season had some odd juxtapositions, with the use of violet vestments, minimal decoration in church, and rather mournful readings, but because it wasn't actually Lent yet,



fasting was not required—in fact, *Mardi Gras*, Fat Tuesday, occurred on the last day of this season¹. One reason for this season was to increase the number of fast-days from 36 (because Sundays are never fast days) to match the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness (Matt. 4:2, Luke 4:1-2), Moses spent on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28), Elijah on his journey to Mount Horeb (1 Kings 19:8), and the forty years the Hebrew people spent in the wilderness on the way to the Promised Land. The liturgical reforms of the mid-twentieth century led the church to focus on essentials, and a season of preparation for Lent (pre-Lent) for a season of preparation for Easter (Lent) was regarded as redundant, obscuring the true focus on the Paschal Mystery of Easter. During Lent we are to focus not only on fasting and penitence themselves, but on these practices as part of the joyful recollection of our baptism and preparation for the celebration of Easter². The Roman Catholic church removed the pre-Lenten season from the liturgical calendar in 1969, and the Episcopal church followed suit in the 1979 Book of Common Prayer.

Under the old liturgical calendar, Pre-Lent would begin on Sunday February 5th, the third Sunday before Ash Wednesday. Although Lent does not begin this year until Ash Wednesday on February 22, in this pre-Lenten (but not –gesima!) time, we might consider now what particular efforts and practices might be helpful this Lent, that we might well-prepared to "enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby [God] has given us life and immortality³. 

Carla baked and shared this baked good with us at the Annual Meeting and here's the recipe!

INGREDIENTS:

2 cans Pillsbury butter crescent rolls

28 oz. packages cream cheese, softened

1 cup sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla

1/4 cup butter, melted

cinnamon & sugar (Carla used about 1/4 cup sugar and 1 Tbsp. cinnamon)

Instructions:

Unroll and spread 1 can crescent rolls on bottom of un-greased pan. Combine softened cream cheese, sugar and vanilla. Spread mixture over crescent rolls. Unroll and spread remaining crescent rolls over mixture. Spread melted butter over the top and sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar. Bake at 350 degrees for 20-30 minutes.
