Holy Week takes us outside of ordinary time and space, where what was, and is, and is to come are all true and present at the same time. We are baptized into the life and death and resurrection of Jesus, so for us, this is not a "reenactment" but a "re-membering"-- re-making us members of Christ's body, and our family story of how nothing has, will, or can ever separate us from the love of God. *Christ is Risen, and life is liberated!*—Saint John Chrysostom (circa 400 AD)

Please join us for Holy Week services, on-site or on-line, that we may, as our Palm Sunday prayer has it, enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts whereby [God has] given us life and immortality.

As I wrote for *Grace Notes* before I had even arrived in Central New York, St. Paul reminds us all,

...our primary identification in Christ is as beloved, and our primary call is to be saints; that is, holy ones. Not because of our particular virtue, or our good works, or because we are especially suited for sainthood, but because, in Christ, "we become what we already are", as the ancient church described it. Inheritors of the kingdom of God. Friends of Jesus. Saints.

As we part company at the end of April, please know that you are and will remain in my prayers. I have loved serving as priest in this community these last eight years, and I am certain that Grace

will continue to be an outpost of the Jesus Movement in Baldwinsville, because YOU are called to be saints in *this* place, at *this* time. As the former U.N. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld once wrote, *For all that has been, Thanks. To all that shall be, Yes.*

From the Senior Warden: Service Time Change

Fellow Members of Grace,

I would like to update you on some changes to services that will happen when Mother Cathy's time with us is over. After some thoughtful consideration, the Vestry has decided that starting on Sunday, May 7th, Spring cleanup, we will move to one service at 9:00 AM. We will alternate between Rite 1 without music and Rite 2 with music. For supply, we have Pastor Nelson Gaetz the first three Sundays in May, Mother Kathy Corley Majors the 1st and 2nd Sundays and Pastor Gaetz the 3rd and 4th Sundays for June through August.

While this is a big change, we tried to come up with a solution that is equitable for many. It also has some benefits:

- It allows us to worship together as one large family.
- Having only one service reduces the number of volunteers needed.
- There is a cost savings paying a supply priest for one service instead of two.

While we begin this transition, I encourage you to continue attending services, praying and worshiping as a community, remaining engaged in the positive work of your committees and stay up to date on pledges.

The Vestry will be very busy working on our next steps and will keep you updated as progress is made. We appreciate your prayer and support as we travel down this path that has been laid before us. Take care, Allen Wolf, Senior Warden


