Greetings, Grace!

Believe it or not, I have been familiar with Grace Episcopal Church since I was a teenager. At various times over the years I have run or driven by the church grounds, never suspecting that I would have the privilege of serving as your rector. There was even one year where I walked over to Grace to cool off after competing in the Baldwinsville Turkey Trot.

Grace is beautiful if you ask me! I am a lifelong Episcopalian who has recently retired from a long career as a college swim coach and adjunct biology instructor at LeMoyne College. Years ago I discerned a call to serve in the Episcopal Church and after my education and the required meetings and examinations I was ordained as a Deacon on December 17, 2022; and as a Priest on July 29, 2023 right here at Grace. I live in Liverpool with my wife Beverly, and we have two adult children, Laurel and Lucas. 



PARKING PERMIT 2023-2024 SEASON

Parking Pass application information for 2023-2024 is scheduled to send via email on August 1st. Active Grace parishioners and those with a connection to the parish have priority if their application is received promptly. Applications will only be received online this year.

For non-active members, the parking pass fee is \$100 for the school year. Look for general application information on our website beginning on August 12th. Applicants will be notified via email late August as to whether they secured a "Parking Permit". We will schedule the distribution of passes the last week of August as we collect the "fee" and paperwork from each student.

July/August Outreach



The Outreach Ministry's July and August project is to collect 16 oz. jars of peanut butter for Baker High School's Bee Full program, which provides food for Baker High School students who may not have a sufficient amount of food for the weekend.

On Friday afternoons and before each vacation, students who are accepted by the program are given a bag of nutritious snacks to take home.

The cost is approximately \$600 a month with supplements from donations. Last year, Grace Church collected almost 100 jars of peanut butter. This was much appreciated since peanut butter is a relatively high-priced item, and is always in short supply. Let's see if we can beat that number this year!
