REFLECTION POOL, By FATHER JOE HANNAH

We are in the midst of our stewardship campaign, my first as your rector. Most of my experience in this area revolved around contacting the friends and alumni of LeMoyne swimming to provide the resources we needed for extra equipment, travel, or improvements to the infrastructure. The college did not provide everything. Our church, however, is very different in mission and character. An athletic team is, for the most part, limited in scope to working hard and competing well in their sport. Yes, they are often involved in some form of community service, but that is not the prime directive. The church, however, exists to serve!

The visible parts of our church center around our worship services and both our "inreach" and "outreach" ministries. We live in a community which, like many others, is filled with people who are experiencing varying levels of need. There is no shortage of service opportunities to help meet this need, and it depends almost entirely on the resources we have available to do our work as the Body of Christ on earth. One good analogy that I wish was my idea is that the visible church is much like the visible portion of a fruit bearing tree. The trunk, leaves, and branches of a tree provide food (fruit), shelter (leaves and branches) and a foundation (trunk) for all who come into contact with it. The sturdier the trunk and the larger the canopy the more of God's creatures the tree can serve!

What folks don't see is the root system. The root system often extends just as far and wide underground as the canopy does above. It is the root system that draws nourishment from the soil to keep the tree growing and healthy. Grace Episcopal Church is "rooted" in Baldwinsville, N.Y..Grace depends on the generous support of the members and friends who both visibly engage in our various ministries and who also (quietly) provide the "nourishment" we need to continue in those ministries. I have a growing optimism that we can even expand our presence in this town! Everyone I have met is both capable and committed to serve.

We all know that a generous supply of mineral laced groundwater is awesome for a tree but a church requires a more practical form of generosity. To the greatest extent possible, we will strive to not waste a penny and that every effort will be made to make Grace a thriving, faithful, house of worship. Any number of biblical quotes are appropriate here, but I like the following in tandem; "Love your neighbor as yourself" and "Feed my sheep". Peace, Fr. Joe
