COOKIE WALK NEWS

Sunday December 8th we will be hosting our annual Cooke Decorating Day!! To prepare for this, we are looking for anyone interested to start baking Sugar Cookie Cut outs (trees/mittens/circles/stars/gingerbread men/hearts/holly leaves/stockings/bells/snowmen/candy canes) and if you start baking now, you can freeze them...giving you lots of time to bake your more specialty Christmas Cookies later this fall!!

These cookies can be left undecorated and delivered to the church by 9 or 10 am on 12/8. Here are two recipes that are tried and true from the kitchen of our own Jeannie LaMere!

Sugar Cookies: 1 cup granulated sugar 1 cup sifted confectioners sugar 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter 1 cup vegetable oil 2 large eggs, lightly beaten 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 5 1/2 cups sifted all purpose flour 1 teaspoon cream of tartar 1 teaspoon baking soda Cream the sugars and butter together. Add the oil; blend in eggs and vanilla. Beat well. Sift together the flour, cream of tartar and baking soda. Add to the sugar mixture, beat again. Chill dough for at least 6 hours. Heat oven to 350 degrees. Roll dough 1/4 inch thick and cut into shapes. Bake for 8-10 minutes. Decorate after cooling Gingerbread Cookies: 2/3 cup (1 stick plus 1/2 TBSP) unsalted butter 1/2 cup packed light brown sugar 2 teaspoons ground ginger 1 teaspoon cinnamon 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves 11/2 teaspoons salt 1 large egg 3/4 cup dark molasses 3 cups sifted all purpose flour 1 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 teaspoon baking powder Cream butter and sugar together. Add spices, salt, egg and molasses and beat well. Sift together the flour and baking powder and baking soda. Add to butter mixture and beat again.

Chill dough for several hours. Heat oven to 350 degrees, roll dough 1/4 inch thick and cut into shapes. Bake 8-10 minutes.
