This year we went to dinner at Pastabilities on Armory Square, which I am told is one of Syracuse's finest restaurants and has been visited at least twice by Food Network's Guy Fieri. What a tale of two worlds! Inside the warm, tastefully decorated restaurant; there were couples, families and friends dining and drinking to their heart's content. For the evening, at least, no one was concerned with the (considerable) expense, and the portions were enormous.

In contrast, during the half mile or so walk from the parking garage to the restaurant in 20 degree weather, we saw a very different reality. There were people asking for spare change who were dressed in threadbare jackets and coats that could not possibly ward off the chill. There was a small group of people huddled in a narrow space between two buildings with plastic bags piled up around them. Speaking in low tones and staring out into the night. The reasons people end up in situations like that are many, and they bear varying degrees of responsibility for their condition, but their existence and their suffering is undeniable. It is particularly difficult to see children in those circumstances. I was reminded of the scene in " A Christmas Carol" where the ghost of Christmas present escorts Scrooge to a bridge, under which a family is huddled around a small fire eating potatoes that had fallen off a cart. The head of the family could find no work.

Of course we should celebrate our good fortune and our relationships with family and friends! On the other hand, part of "the work we have been given to do " is to see outside of the shells we create around ourselves- to expand our field of vision to see those whose realities are very different from ours. Ministry to those in need is the greatest mission of the church. May our generosity, and our faith, continue to grow in 2025. Peace, Fr. Joe
